

BOARD OF SELECTMEN MEETING
SEPTEMBER 2, 2014

PRESENT: George Lawrence, Chairman, Becky Doyle, Woody Meiszner, Joanne Meshna

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. at the Town Office.

Minutes: Selectman Doyle made a motion to approve the minutes of the August 26, 2014 meeting. Selectman Meiszner seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Selectman Doyle made a motion to approve the minutes of the non public session meeting of August 26, 2014. Selectman Meiszner seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Historical Society: Selectman Meiszner announced several items from the Town Office had been moved to the Historical Society including a display case with tools, a butter churn, ballot box, safe, table, Boston Post Cane, and books. The items were located in an area in the Town Office where they could not be seen by the public. Now they are available for viewing by the public.

Jalen Drive: Selectman Meiszner reported he had a call from a homeowner on Jalen Drive questioning approval of the road by the Town. Selectmen Lawrence and Meiszner along with Public Works Director Goewey inspected the site. There was no top coat on the road. Homeowners were concerned about snow plowing not being done adequately. Selectman Meiszner contacted Bob Hakala who did the subdivision. Mr. Hakala is not planning on doing a top coat on the road and disputed the fact that the snow plowing was not being done adequately. There is a maintenance agreement for the road that states Mr. Hakala will maintain the road. If the homeowners are unhappy with the maintenance, they have that recourse.

Roads: David Cotzin informed the Board pot holes on Poor Farm Road had been repaired on Wednesday of last week. He added that Wheeler Road has dangerous pot holes and needed patching, and the Selectmen will pass that along to Director Goewey. Paving is to begin on October 1. Mr. Cotzin suggested redoing the yellow lines on roads as they are faded.

Vacant Positions: Selectmen Doyle noted that the Board is interviewing candidates for the Town Administrator position and have interviewed candidates for the Highway Department position.

1473 Turnpike Road: Selectman Lawrence spoke with the real estate agent involved with the sale of the property and she was visiting the site this past Friday. People have left trash at the site and Selectman Lawrence encouraged people to call the police if they see anything suspicious.

Senator Peggy Gilmore: Senator Gilmore noted the time for filing new legislation was approaching. Repaving of routes 123 and 124 is scheduled. Mr. Cotzin informed Senator Gilmore about the dangerous intersection of Nashua Road and Route 124 where there have been several accidents, and suggested a blinking yellow light and making stop signs more visible.

At 6:35 p.m. Selectman Doyle made a motion to enter into a non public session under RSA91-A:3II(c). Selectman Meiszner seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

At 7:25 p.m. Selectman Lawrence made a motion to return to public session. Selectman Doyle seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Selectman Lawrence announced that the minutes from the non public session had been sealed.

The meeting adjourned at 7:25 p.m.
